One of the most insightful contemplations in the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius is the one on the nativity of Our Lord. Ignatius asks us to use our senses in imagining the sight, sound, smell, taste and touch of the scene. Unlike the sanitised nativity scene we often encounter in Advent and Christmas, the events of that night were far from perfect. Mary gave birth to Jesus in a dark, dirty and smelly stable. Yet, in this imperfect and unplanned setting, God came amongst us on earth. Therefore, we can ask ourselves this reflective question. Do I think that my life needs to be perfect, or that my prayers need to be perfect and planned, or that my retreats have to be perfect before I can focus on God and ask God to be present in my life? I'd say no.

The retreat started early Friday morning with a Mass and as it also coincided with the Singapore Presidential Election, participants were given Friday afternoon to go to their respective polling stations to cast their votes.

MAS Regional Superior, Fr. Francis Lim S.J. led the retreatants through Gratitude for Creation and each was reminded that in the beginning, God had put chaos into order. Many loved his image of the water falling like a dome with small windows that rain could then fall unto earth.

Each session had a sub-theme such as Gratitude and God, Gratitude for My Life, From the Beginning, Contemplating God in Nature,

God is Still Creating Anew for Me, Finding God in All Things and All is a Gift from God Above. Many of the participants were touched knowing that God is still continually creating us day by day.

There were also opportunities for spiritual conversations in the evening and the participants gained insights, felt assured and found comfort in their prayer journeys. They all found sacred spaces and places for silence, prayer, reflection and journaling.

Some delighted in the symphony of the palm leaves swinging in the wind. Others marvelled at the ants living in harmony under the big tree which grows in silence. Everyone was happy, relishing and being more aware of the Season of Creation: Love of God in Creation.

FR MICHAEL ROSSMANN, SJ, IN SINGAPORE

Thursday, 10 August 2023, 7:45pm,
Fr. Michael Rossman, S.J., an American Jesuit,
arrived in Singapore, taking his first steps
into Southeast Asia. A doctoral student at the
Gregorian University in Rome, and author
of the award-winning book 'The Freedom
of Missing Out' and 'One Minute Jesuit'
podcast originator, Fr. Michael was invited
by Kingsmead Centre and the MAS Vocation
Promotion and Young People teams to
present several talks and retreats in Malaysia
and Singapore.

At Kingsmead Centre, Fr. Michael presented three evening talks - Freedom of Missing Out on 14 August, The Spiritual Exercises in Contemporary Times with Young People on 5 September and Modern Day Discernment on 6 September 2023. Each evening gathered a crowd of about 100 people, eager and excited to hear about the new FOMO and Discernment, incorporating

the Spiritual Exercises and living the dynamics in contemporary times. Fr. Michael charmed and inspired many to think outside the box and to become more aware of how God constantly invites one to move from fear to freedom in our commitments.

Media is another area of Fr. Michael's expertise, being the originator of 'One Minute Jesuit' podcast. Fr. Michael explored how media could be used to share the Gospels and reach out to a wider audience, especially the young. The two retreats Fr. Michael facilitated and assisted by the KC Spirituality Team, saw 18 retreatants benefitting from their weekend stay at KC.

Fr. Michael inspired the 312 participants at the 3 evening talks and 2 weekend retreats with his youthfulness, generosity of insights and the American smile. We are grateful for his presence here with us and are delighted with his new found love for durians, all 101 varieties!
